2. OPIS PREDMETA			
2.1. Ciljevi predmeta (najviše: 200 riječi)	This course acquaints the student with the interaction of Jews and Arabs in the Middle East from the time of the First <i>Aliyah</i> and the birth of Zionism as organized political movement. Arab-Jewish relations will be discussed within different political contexts: late Ottoman Period, Mandate Period, State of Israel 1948-1967, State of Israel from 1967-1993, and State of Israel 1993 – present. While focus will be put on the Eretz Israel, even other Middle Eastern countries with significant Jewish presence will be discussed, in particular Syria, Lebanon, Iraq and Egypt. The course will address interaction between Jews and Arabs in broad variety: from peaceful coexistence to different forms of collision and conflict. The course is interdisciplinary in its approach to the topic. Political processes will be analyzed <i>inter alia</i> from different aspects of history, nationalism, economy, ideology, security, religion, language and civilization.

<p>2.3. Ishodi učenja na razini studijskog programa kojima predmet pridonosi *</p>	<p>A main purpose of the course is to follow relations between Jews and Arabs since the beginning of Zionism to the present time. The Zionist movement introduced a new dynamics in an already complex relation of two peoples and their religions. The new dynamics has been partially built on old views, prejudices, perceptions, and common history. Interaction between the two peoples was additionally influenced by series of external events, such as colonialism or collapse of the Ottoman Empire, which will also be addressed. Through this course the student will follow development of Arab-Jewish relations, while discerning which features of their interactions were a product of Zionism, which have existed before the time of Zionism, and which were modified through Zionist political, social and military achievements.</p> <p>The student will be acquainted with main events of the Zionist enterprise in the Palestine, later State of Israel, and will understand some basic ideas which dominated Jewish and Arab societies in the course of those events.</p>
